Enveloped in understated opulence and enhanced by a bespoke concierge service, it provides an unparalleled setting for exclusive-use escapes.

Whether you choose to explore Palma's bustling streets or venture further to discover Mallorca's ravishing beaches, remote mountain ranges and historic hilltop towns, Vestige Miramar promises a timeless retreat where unforgettable memories await.



Begin your exploration just next door with the iconic Palma Cathedral, a breathtaking Gothic landmark whose awe-inspiring interior was reimagined by the renowned Catalan visionary Antoni Gaudí. Opposite the cathedral stands Palau de l'Almudaina, originally constructed as a formidable Islamic fort and now a royal residence. Wander through its series of lavishly adorned, stone-walled rooms steeped in history.

For a dose of retail therapy, head to Passeig del Born, a prominent tree-lined avenue offering luxury shopping just a short walk away. Nearby, the Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art (the Es Baluard) awaits, housing a significant collection of over 600 masterpieces by artists such as Cézanne, Gauguin, Picasso, Miró and Magritte.

When it's time to unwind, the sandy shores of Platja de Can Pere Antoni beckon — a leisurely 20-minute stroll from home.





Vestige Miramar's architectural style is a quintessential example of 19th-century well-to-do mansions in Palma. Its impressive cubic form, symmetrical windows, Italianate gallery and columned porches (porxos) are characteristic of the era. During the restoration, our team faced the daunting task of interpreting layers of history then harmonising the historical elements with contemporary demands, all while preserving the building's soul.


Traditional techniques and materials played a vital role. Lime mortar, prized for its compatibility with historical construction, was used for its breathability and natural aging properties. Local craftspeople, including carpenters, blacksmiths and stonemasons, were integral to the process, infusing the project with the spirit of Mallorca's artisanal heritage. Carpenters fashioned intricate roof structures, while stonemasons worked with local marés sandstone to create finishes that both honoured the past and refined the revived spaces.













Sleeping up to 16 guests in eight serene bedrooms laid out over two floors, this stylish accommodation offers the ultimate privacy and seclusion for groups, while also maintaining flexibility for families with young children. The sea-facing master suite offers a spacious 48 m2 arrangement with a lounge area and ensuite bathroom plus a separate shower room. An additional service bedroom is also available.

The interiors draw inspiration from Palma's historical heritage while embracing contemporary form and function, balancing a little of the patina and imperfections of the past with every modern comfort. By choosing antique treasures and custom-made furniture, bespoke pieces ensure comfort without compromising on aesthetics, while carefully-sourced antiques such as fireplaces, fountains, furniture and art, add an authentic touch.

To pull everything together, the team curated a palette of rich textures, high-quality textiles and distinctive finishes, including marble, quartzite, metals and wood.



- **Best for art**: Miró Majorca Foundation, once his home and studio, now a fascinating cultural centre offering unique insights into his life and work. View an exhibition, stay for a workshop, stroll through the gardens spotting his colourful sculptures.
- **Best for fine dining:** Zaranda, a Michelinstarred restaurant offering an impeccable, perfectly balanced I4-course tasting menu bursting with local flavours. Children over 16 only.
- **Best for brunch:** Solo Santa Catalina, a tempting brunch spot with a view. Tuck into an extensive menu featuring hearty vegan options and fluffy pancakes.





- **Best towns:** there are numerous delightful towns to visit but top of the list are hilltop Deià and captivating Sóller arrive on the traditional train from Palma for an authentic, scenic journey.
- **Best beaches:** with over 300 beaches wrapping around the island, you're spoilt for choice, from Palma's glitzy Playa s'Arenal to myriad secret, deserted coves. Visit Platja de Formentor's narrow strip of golden sand backed by pine forests in a secluded bay and lively Playa de Alcúdia for watersports and family fun. Cala Mondragó in the national park is pristine with few amenities while Platja des Trenc wouldn't look out of place in the Caribbean.
- **Best for walking:** whether you prefer a gentle stroll or a day-long hike, Mallorca delivers. Discover the wildlife-rich Tramuntana Sierra mountain range if you fancy a challenge or the greener, more easy-going Sierra de Levante. Spring and autumn are usually the best time for serious walking.
- Best for water activities: diving, snorkeling, SUP, boat trips, jet skiing and more. The dive season runs from April to October where an array of marine life and colourful coral reefs put on a display in the crystal-clear waters. Snorkelers are equally rewarded with wondrous sightings of reef fish and larger creatures.
